

What responses to COVID-19 by Christians have inspired you? Frustrated you?

The teaching this week focused on the expectations we have of God concerning tragedies. One pastor based his expectation on Psalm 91:3. Many have voiced the same expectation

Read Psalm 116:6 and Psalm 18:19.

What does it mean, then, when we are not rescued? What good is God if God does not rescue us from things like COVID-19?

Is seeing God as a superhero hurtful or helpful?

We all see the value of hope! But most of us define "hope" in terms of outcome.

Read Habakkuk 3:17-19. Notice the situation the prophet describes.

What is his response to the situation? Take another look at verse 18. What difference does that little word "yet" make in his life? In your life? Where do we get a "yet" type of life?

Read Jeremiah 29:11.

Jeremiah is an "exile" prophet, meaning he preached when the Hebrew people were living in captivity - in exile - in Babylon. They had lost their jobs, their homes, their country.

What encouragement do you get from these words from Jeremiah?

The word "hope" in this verse is literally the word "cord". It is something to hang on to.

What is your "cord" during COVID-19?
