How would our country be different if we actually followed Jesus' command?

Sunday's teaching included a story of a Buddhist teacher leading victims of the Khmer Rouge regime in Cambodia to say this prayer taken from Buddhist Scripture:

Hatred never ceases by hatred; But by love alone is healed. This is an ancient and eternal law.

What does that "sameness" say to us about truth?

How does this teaching affect your response to the "enemies" of your life?
